Payroll Cutoff will be effected by holidays.


Monthly payroll cutoff will be 5 p.m. **Monday, December 23rd.**

Department Highlight: Undergraduate Admission Evaluators

Learn about the behind-the-scenes work of Admissions!

There are 7 full time staff dedicated to new undergraduate domestic applications to the University of Iowa as well as 1 full time staff person dedicated to international applications. The undergraduate evaluations team receives tens of thousands of applications every year that they evaluate and determine student's admissibility. Most of the applications are current high school seniors who are applying for the fall semester but they also receive thousands of transfer applications, process course evaluations, and process current student applications for those looking to change colleges.

Looking at the numbers:

- They have received approximately 25,400 first-year undergraduate domestic applications, an increase of 12.5% from this time last year.
- They have admitted approximately 17,000 students, an increase of 14% from this time last year.
- They are up 14.5% for international applications and are up 9.9% in international admits.
 - The top 4 countries are India, China, Vietnam and South Korea

Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) Ruling:

A federal judge recently struck down the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) overtime rule that went into effect July 1, 2024.

As a result, the salary required for exemption status will be lowered from \$43,888 to \$35,568, effective Dec. 8, 2024.

Impacted staff and supervisors have been notified.
